Responsive, Large Group Learning Series

A Networked Approach to Professional Learning

Networks take a variety of forms and build on a theory of cultivating collective efficacy. Networks are supported within schools, across schools, district-wide, and digitally.

ILT members will be supporting schools by connecting groups of educators to others within and beyond their school to form responsive communities of practice that are anchored in what is going on for learners in each context.

Job-Embedded Learning Together with Educators

Emergent, Immersive Learning Partnerships

Reimagining the concept of networking, these opportunities connect educators within and across schools in reciprocal, collaborative learning relationships to learn, examine our practice, play with our pedagogical ideas, and reflect together.

Experiential Classroom Learning Opportunities

Connected to learning partnerships or other responsive supports, these are opportunities to see, feel, and experience learning in action and then to reflect and intentionally set next steps. Experiences will be connected to educator inquiries and based on what is going on for the learners in their classrooms.

Emergent, Responsive Support

As interests and needs emerge at schools and across schools, we will engage in learning with groups of educators to connect, explore, and learn together around what is going on for their students, based on the OECD's Principles of Learning and the First Peoples Principles of Learning.
